Parent input is gathered from parent surveys and meetings throughout the school year. Parents are encouraged to speak with building and district administration when concerns arise or to share insight. Additionally, some parents may serve on various committees to help address needs and concerns.

Parental Involvement in Students’ Individual Reading Plans

ISIP reading results are shared with parents after fall, winter, and spring testing sessions. Parents are informed of interventions their child is taking part in, and asked to provide feedback. Teachers provide parents with materials and ideas to best help their child at home to improve their literacy skills. Students who are not proficient will be progress monitored bi-weekly, these reports will be shared with parents on a regular basis. Teachers are responsible to keep record of progress monitoring in the Milepost program, which provides an easy to understand graph for parents. iStation a research-based program that will be used for all students allowing for parents to access their students’ accounts at home. Students can work on the program at home with Internet access. If students do not have Internet access at home the public library provides computers with Internet for use. Also, available for students who do not have Internet access are worksheets and activities that can be printed from iStation and sent home with the student. The iStation program will provide a parent letter that describes iStation. The letter will also describe ways parents can help continue their child’s literacy education at home.
